To help with understanding what I am writing in this edition you will need to have a Bible to hand.

I have just read a reflection on 1 Timothy 4 in the synod daily devotions.

Paul's 1st letter to Timothy chapter 4 offers advice to Timothy as a Minister but it can equally be applied to the Elders and Members of Hallfold Church family, as we minister to each other.

The letter starts with a warning against false and useless teaching, which may lead you into a wrong way of life. It rejects teaching that leads to enforced behaviour or restraint in favour of a grateful heart, full of thanksgiving for all God gives us, and a confidence in our faith. We are expected to be as generous as God with our dealings with others.

What the life of faith means in practice is a sustained and sustainable lifestyle, one that has to be worked at. It is easy to have thankfulness when things go well. However, when we are upto our neck in it, struggling to keep our temper, dignity or confidence we may find gratitude less easy. Verses 8 to 10 remind Timothy of the hope that is in us. A hope that can sustain us through thick and thin. We all need reminding of this from time to time.

Verse 14 implores *Do not neglect the gift that is in you.* This is a reminder and encouragement to all church family to be intentional in what they do. To consider how best to use their talents for God, in this place and elsewhere. But also to accept that no one person has all the gifts the Church needs but to accept that God has provided all the gifts so that the whole Church has the gifts and talents required for His mission here.

I am mindful that Elders are called to be servants to the Church, in humility and meekness and to strive for the Unity of the Church.

With the Members of this Church family we can work together to deliver His mission with grateful hearts, not because we have to, but because we want to.

Your Secret'Arry



This year Hallfold has taken part in the door to door delivery and collection envelopes in the area and has hosted a Big Breakfast. In total we raised £685 for Christian Aid.

Christian Aid believes in 'Life before death' and aims to send help to refugees and to eradicate poverty. Christian Aid state that 'Poverty is an outrage - it robs people of dignity and hope, of power over their own lives.' Their vision is to end poverty, believing that this vision can become a reality.

- 75p could pay for a malaria rapid diagnostic test kit in Zambia early diagnosis saves lives.
- £1 could pay for a chick in Cambodia, helping a family to set up a poultryrearing business. This will bring in extra money and provide them with a better diet.
- £5 could pay for 100 text messages to be sent to 100 farmers in Kenya to provide them with a local weather forecast update, helping them adapt their farming to the conditions.



The Night Sky

If you happen to be still up at 10:26pm on Tuesday June 6th look up to the sky and you should see the International Space Station passing over our location. It will be visible for about 5 minutes. (This of course depends on the sky being free of clouds which sadly is impossible to guarantee in North West England). The ISS was built to be a space environment research laboratory and observatory, where crew members could conduct experiments in many scientific fields including: biology, human biology, physics, astronomy, and meteorology. It has 2 bathrooms, a gym and more room than a 6 bedroom house. Up to April 2017, 227 individuals have made 390 spaceflights to the ISS, The International Space Station travels in orbit around Earth at a speed of roughly 17,150 miles per hour (that's about 5 miles per second!). This means that the Space Station orbits Earth once every 92 minutes. The ISS orbits Earth at an altitude of between 205 miles and 270 miles. When the astronauts have free time they enjoy looking down at our beautiful Blue Planet.
